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# Explanation on Statistics Information Delay

Dear Oshtemo Township Citizens:

As most of you are aware on October 30, 2018 we consolidated our county dispatch centers into one authority. At this time The Kalamazoo County Sheriff's Office ended its relationship with are current CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) system provider Intergraph and are now being dispatched with a new CAD system called New World by the KCCDA (Kalamazoo County Consolidated Dispatch Authority).

Because it is a completely new CAD system we are having to build new formulas for extracting specific data our agency desires. Specifically the data we require to provide townships with statistical data. Our IT department is working with the Dispatch Authority to build and implement these formulas. We have also made them aware of the data that we provide to each of you monthly and yearly and they are working to build specific formulas to extract this data as well.

After these formulas are built we will extract the data and make sure it is coding calls appropriately and that we are receiving the data we need to provide you the statics you request. Currently we have requested a timeline for this process and are waiting to hear back from the IT department and Dispatch Authority.

As soon as we are given a timeline your township liaison will provide this to you and any necessary updates. Currently we do not anticipate any major issues other than you may receive your monthly statists at a later date to be determined by the timeline. Any statics we can provide without the CAD system will continue to be provided.

Thank you all for your patience's and understanding in the implementation of this new system.

## Updates on Previous and Recent Investigations

### **Sept. 19, 2018 18-10540- Burglary with Forced Entry/Arson- 2491 Isle Harbor Ct, Westport Village Condominiums.**

Detective Bureau reports they have exhausted all investigative leads. Lab reports sent in for head gas readings to determine if an accelerant was used came back negative, no ignitable liquid detected. KCSO believes rubbing alcohol was used. A print was received from the bottle and send for identification to Kalamazoo Forensics lab. KCSO is still waiting for any results on the print. DNA swabs have been sent to the MSP lab. DNA processing is running approximately 6 months behind per MSP. Det. Boisonault.

### **Sept. 30, 2018 18-011082, Murder/Homicide, 1300 Block Concord Apts.**

Victim Charles Hough was stabbed by suspect Calvin Carter Jr. after a night a partying and drug use. Hough died from his injuries and the prosecutor has issued a warrant for Homicide on CARTER. CARTER was taken in to custody that morning and is still lodged at KCSO awaiting trial. Det. Misner

### **Nov. 4, 2018 18-013185, Assault with intent to Murder, 5900 BLK of Cooper Beach Blvd.**

After KCSO Deputies responded to a shots fired call in the area of Drake and KL Ave a Copper Beach security guard made contact with KCSO and advised it sounded like the shots came from within the complex. Shortly after not locating anything Borgess Hospital reported a victim (Derrick Render Jr) in their ER with a gunshot wound and the parties transporting him left the hospital. It was found by KCSO that RENDER is a resident at Copper Beech and claims to have been shot by 3 unknown males in the parking lot. KCSO is currently investigating believes the shooting may have been the result of a fight that happened earlier in the apartment. This case may also be drug related. This is an ongoing investigation and KCSO does have a person of interest. While KCSO as investigating all leads of this incident they are receiving limited cooperation and involved parties are being less then forthcoming. Open Active- Det. R. Johnson

### **Nov. 7, 2018 18-13322 Armed Robbery 5601 W. Main St. Advanced America**

At 10:15 am KCSO Deputies responded to an armed robbery at 5601 W Main St. The suspect, an unidentified black male wearing a grey hoodie and surgical face mask threatened the clerk and got away with an undisclosed amount of money. Silent Observer is offering up to \$1000.00 for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of the suspect. KCSO believes this case could be related to a similar robbery committed in September in Benton Township. KCSO is

looking into several leads, however nothing more can be released at this time, due to the sensitive nature of this inform.

**Nov. 20, 2018 18-13926 Strong Armed Robbery Lowes on W. Main St.**

KCSO Deputies took a report of a Strong Armed Robbery at Lowes on W Main St. Three black males entered the store and overwhelmed the clerk purchasing large amounts of gift cards and then trying to return gifts cards for cash with no monies on them. Once the clerk caught on to the scam they attempted to intimidate her for cash and then they forcefully took the money from the register. Another Lowe's customer was pushed out of the way when they attempted to help the clerk. The suspects escaped in an Enterprise rental 2018 Hyundai Tucson with California plates of 8BOL152. The case is active an open. Det. R. Johnson

**Nov. 26, 2018 18-014173 Assault with Intent to Murder Croyden Apt. Victim was stabbed.**

KCSO Deputies responded to a fight in Croyden apartments where someone was possibly stabbed. Upon arrival it was found that one male subject was stabbed and assaulted by another male in an apartment. An altercation between two males and a female originally started the fight. A suspect was identified and the prosecutor's office has issued a warrant for Mohammed Alradhwan for Assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than murder. The suspect has been taken into custody by KCSO. Det. Misner

**Nov. 27, 2018 18-14217 Armed Robbery/UDAA 1300 BLK of Concord Place Dr. While making**

a marihuana delivery the victim was stopped by an unknown black male in the stairwell of Concord Apartments. He was pistol whipped and his phone, marihuana and car keys where taken. The unknown suspect gave his phone back to him and fled in the victim's 2007 Chevy Trailblazer in an unknown direction. No additional updates at this time. Det. R. Johnson.

Mail thefts have slowed, but still seeing some. Through our office, MSP, KDPS, in conjunction with the United States Postal Service, multiple Federal Warrants have been issued for several individuals, up to ten or more for Mail theft, FTD device crimes and U&P crimes. This has been a coordinated effort over a ten month span, involving several agencies at multiple levels. D/Sgt. Boisonault and D/Sgt. Ryan Johnson have done an outstanding job from our office spearheading most of this.

Currently D/Sgt. Ryan Johnson and D/Sgt. Misner are working with the prosecutor's office and KDPS, involving two separate RICO (Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act) investigations. These are two separate crews that have been involved in many of Kalamazoo Counties property crimes including, (Larceny from Vehicles, FTD device crimes, U&P, Home Invasions and Illegal Narcotics) over the last 10-12 months. The main players in these crews are being held in custody and the court proceedings are in the early stages. The majority of these groups' crimes were targeted in the Oshtemo Township, business district, apartment and residential areas of the Township.

## Community Policing Update

Currently Lt. Greenlee has received 6 "snowbird" requests from Oshtemo residents leaving the area for the winter months. Automatic property checks have been set up for each of these residents 4-5 times throughout each month. Also Deputies have been given these addresses and may do additional checks during their down time. On November 6, 2018 automatic public relation checks were made at each Oshtemo precinct during Election Day. In addition to the PR checks each Oshtemo Deputy was assigned two precinct's each to check in on throughout the voting day. Several Directed Patrol requests throughout the month have been ongoing. Some of the specific areas targeted have been 8<sup>th</sup> St between KL and Stadium for truck drivers. H Ave near 10<sup>th</sup> for reports of speeders and Huntington Run for a report of a "peeping tom" from their community watch group. As always Deputies may and do initiate their own directed patrols.

On November 15<sup>th</sup> CPO Dep. Dave Rowe gave an Active Assailant presentation to staff at 58 West. On November 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Dep. Rowe attending a Church Security and Intruder Response Training hosted by Centerpoint Church on 2345 n 10<sup>th</sup> St. Dep. Rowe has also met with 8 managers from various apartment complexes and hotel business reference crime in their areas. Dep. Rowe continues to offer Active Assailant presentations to the community.
